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8. What is 'metaphysical conceit' ? Give examples.

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9. Examine the role of Sylphs in The Rape of the Lock.

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10. Consider Shelley as a revolutionary poet.

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11. Why did theatre decline in the romantic age ?

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12. What are the features of decadence in the late Nineteenth Century literature.

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13. Write down the major constituents of the Imagist movement.

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14. What are the characteristics of the 'drama of ideas'.

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15. What is Campus Novel ?

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16. Consider animal imagery in the poetry of Ted Hughes.

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17. What is Catharsis ?

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**18.** Define the principles of 'Practical Criticism'.

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**19.** What is Culture Studies ?

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20. What are the essential principles of New Historicism ?

23. Bring out the differences between the 'Behaviourist' and the 'Mentalist' approaches to language teaching. Which of the two would you prefer for teaching English in India ?
24. Write a brief essay on 'Individual variation in Language Learning' with special emphasis on language aptitude, motivation, and age.

25. How would you differentiate between the features of 'spoken' language and 'written' language ? Do you need different sets of 'Materials' for the teaching of these varieties in India ?

**European Literature from Classical Age to the 20th Century**

21. Examine the relationship between Faust and Gretchen in Goethe's Faust.
22. 'Camus explores the idea of absurdity of the world, inevitability of death, and the importance of physical life'. Examine.
23. Discuss Divine Comedy as a Christian allegory.
24. Discuss Herman Hesse as a critic of German materialistic values.
25. Comment on the omniscient narrator in Anna Karenina.

22. Examine the treatment of history in the novels of Salman Rushdie.

24. Bring out the strengths and limitations of Tagore as a dramatist.
25. "The concept of 'Indian Literature' owes much to the development of translation in India". Discuss.

**American and other Non-British English Literatures**

21. Discuss Robert Frost as a precursor of modernism in American poetry.
22. Examine the treatment of race and gender in Alice Walker's fiction.
23. Evaluate Margaret Atwood's contribution towards the construction of Canadian identity.

24. Consider A.D. Hope as a modern poet with neo-classical leanings.
25. "Alienation and isolation emerge as the major themes in the works of V.S. Naipaul". Discuss.

22. Enumerate Roland Barther's typology of codes.
23. What are the major similarities and differences between new criticism and formalism ?
24. Examine the importance of linguistics to the study of Structuralism.
25. Attempt a critique of Edward Said's concept of 'Orientalism'.
